

encouraging them to work together and reverse the massive deforestation affecting the region as a result of the terrible economic situation that afflicts thousands of Peruvians in the Amazon.

Spoor indicated that their claim pretended to discredit the company, accusing it of having violated the rights to enjoy a healthy environment.

“This is not only false, but does not recognize the good practices we are implementing for the Amazon sustainability and a healthy coexistence with neighboring communities, especially with native communities, based on respect for their customs and autonomous decisions”, he emphasized.

He specified that certain NGOs have developed a “modus operandi” that abuses the judicial system by filing frivolous claims against Ocho Sur with the sole purpose to damage its image, affect its reputation and the relationship with its clients, in order to attract foreign resources that will help them continue fabricating conflicts that only benefit these organizations.

Finally, Michael Spoor reaffirmed that Ocho Sur has successfully engaged near two thousand workers to join the formal sector, with decent and well-paid jobs; and that, thanks to their social responsibility policy, thousands of Ucayali inhabitants living in remote areas now have better health benefits, education, roads, fresh water and other services.

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
